CONCENTRATION: EQUINE INTERNAL MEDICINE

NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: 1

DESCRIPTION:

This residency is a 3-year (36 months), full time, post-graduate program of 108 credits obtained mostly from clinical training. A diploma (D.E.S.) is awarded on completion of the program. The intensive clinical training is concentrated in the field of **equine internal medicine**. There is additional training in other selected specialties in order to meet the requirements of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine. The resident will participate in the clinical examination of animals (outpatients, emergencies and hospitalized patients) and in the daily supervision of interns and undergraduate students during their rotations in equine internal medicine. He (she) may also be asked to supervise the teaching laboratories of junior students. The resident will also participate in emergency duty according to the Equine Hospital requirements. The resident is required to complete a research project, for which financial support is available. Residents are eligible for 3 weeks of holidays per year. Veterinary medical activities performed outside the residency program are not allowed. A master program may be offered after satisfactory completion of the first year of the residency.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Doctor in veterinary medicine degree (DVM) or a diploma judged equivalent
- Have completed an internship or have equivalent experience
- Acquire a license to practice from l'Ordre des Médecins Vétérinaires du Québec before beginning the program
- Working knowledge of the French language

TUITION FEES (Amounts shown are in Canadian currency):

- Landed immigrants and Canadian citizens living in Quebec, French citizens : +/- \$4,800 / year
- Landed immigrants and Canadian citizens not living in Quebec : +/- \$12,000 / year
- Other nationalities : +/- \$26,000 / year

REMUNERATION:

- \$25,000 /1st year
- \$27,000 /2nd year*
- \$29,000 /3rd year*

* Continuation of a second and third year depends on the mutual satisfaction of the resident and the Faculty.

The resident is allotted a total amount of \$2,500 to attend two conferences in his specialty during his/her program. (maximum amount per activity: \$1,500).

APPLICATION:

For this date the applicant must provide the documents requested in the application plus the following documents:

- a letter of intent,
- a resume,
- a photograph,
- three letters of reference each accompanied by the [personal evaluation grid](#).

International students must also provide :

 - transcripts of each year of veterinary studies specifying the GPA and class rank

Disclosure of candidate selection
