**POSITION: SMALL ANIMAL INTERNAL MEDICINE RESIDENCY**

**NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: 1**

**DESCRIPTION:**

This residency is a 3-year (36 months), full time, graduate program comprised of 108 credits obtained primarily in clinical training. An advanced graduate degree diploma (D.E.S.) is awarded upon completion of the program and candidates are prepared for board certification by the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (ACVIM). The intensive clinical training is focused in the field of small animal medicine. There is additional training in other selected specialties in order to meet the requirements of the ACVIM, including a strong focus on cardiology. The resident will also actively participate in the well-established Interventional Radiology Service and the Small Animal Blood Bank which provides canine blood products throughout Canada. The resident participates in the clinical examination of patients (outpatients, emergency and hospitalized patients) and is responsible for the care of hospitalized patients outside of regular working hours. Residents participate in after hours on call on a regular basis (one week out of two or three). The resident is required to complete a clinical research project and participate in the daily supervision of undergraduate students in small animal medicine. He (she) will also be asked to supervise junior teaching laboratories. Residents are eligible for 3 weeks of holidays per year, scheduled with the program director. If the resident is not on emergency duty, they are eligible for the standard civic holidays. Any veterinary medical activities performed outside the residency program must be declared and approved by the program director and the associate dean for clinical training and continuing education. A master's program may be offered after satisfactory completion of the first year.

**REQUIREMENTS:**

- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) or equivalent
- Completion of an internship or equivalent experience
- Practising license from the Ordre des Médecins Vétérinaires du Québec
- Working knowledge of French

**TUITION FEES (Amounts shown are in Canadian currency):**

- Landed immigrants and Canadian citizens living in Quebec, French citizens, Francophone Belgian citizens : +/- \$4,600 / year
- Landed immigrants and Canadian citizens not living in Quebec : +/- \$11,500 / year
- Other nationalities : +/- \$16,200 / year

**SALARY:**

- \$27,000 /1<sup>st</sup> year
- \$29,000 /2<sup>nd</sup> year\*
- \$31,000 /3<sup>rd</sup> year\*

To these amounts are added 3.6 % for benefits and 3 % for the payment of public holidays.

\* Continuation of the program to a second and third year depends on the mutual satisfaction of the resident and the Faculty.

*The resident is allotted a total amount of \$3,000 to attend two conferences in his specialty during his/her program. (maximum amount per activity: \$2,000)*
