POSITION: BOVINE MEDICINE AND SURGERY

NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: 1

DESCRIPTION:

This residency is a 3-year (36 months), full time, graduate program of 108 credits obtained mostly from clinical training. A specialized study diploma (D.E.S.) is awarded on completion of the program. The intensive clinical training is concentrated in the field of bovine medicine and surgery. There is additional training in other selected specialties (pathology, theriogenology, etc). The candidate will have the opportunity to enroll into one of the following college: ACVIM-LA (internal medicine), and ECBHM (herd health management). The decision can be taken prior to the beginning of the residency or during the first 6 months of training. The teaching personnel supervising the resident is composed of 3 professors diplomate of the ACVIM, 2 professors diplomate of the ACVS and 2 professors diplomate of the ECBHM. The resident is required to complete a clinical research project and participate in the daily supervision of undergraduate students in bovine medicine and / or surgery. He (she) may also be asked to supervise the teaching laboratories of junior students. Every three weeks, the resident will also participate in night, weekend and holiday emergency duty. Residents are eligible for 3 weeks holiday per year which will be determined by the program director and the clinical service to which the resident is attached according to the needs of the service. If the resident is not on emergency duty, they are also eligible for the standard set of statutory holidays during the year. Any veterinary medical activity performed outside the residency program must be declared to the student's program director and to the associate dean for clinical training and continuing education. A master's program may be offered after satisfactory completion of the first year.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) or equivalent
- Completion of an internship or equivalent experience
- Practising license from the Ordre des Médecins Vétérinaires du Québec
- Working knowledge of French

TUITION FEES (Amounts shown are in Canadian currency):

- Landed immigrants and Canadian citizens living in Quebec, French citizens, Francophone Belgian citizens : +/- \$4,600 / year
- Landed immigrants and Canadian citizens not living in Quebec : +/- \$11,500 / year
- Other nationalities : +/- \$16,200 / year

REMUNERATION:

- \$27,000 /1st year
- \$29,000 /2nd year*
- \$31,000 /3rd year*

To these amounts are added 3.6 % for benefits and 3 % for the payment of public holidays.

* Continuation of the program to a second and third year depends on the mutual satisfaction of the resident and the Faculty.

The resident is also allotted a total amount of \$3,000 to attend two conferences in his specialty during his/her program. (maximum amount per activity: \$2,000)
