POSITION: INTERVENTIONAL RADIOLOGY & INTERVENTIONAL ENDOSCOPY: SMALL ANIMAL, MULTISPECIES

NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: 1

DESCRIPTION:

This internship in veterinary clinical sciences is an intensive clinical training program of 12 months (53 weeks) duration. A certificate is awarded upon completion of the program. The program includes clinical training and participation in clinical teaching rounds on the interventional medicine service. The specialized intern will work in the Centre Hospitalier Universitaire Vétérinaire (CHUV) and will be supervised by clinicians, professors and the program coordinator. The intern will provide after hours patient care on a rotating basis. Interns are eligible for three non-consecutive vacation weeks determined by the program director. Any professional activities performed outside the internship program must be declared to the associate dean for clinical training and continuing education.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Interest in interventional radiology and endoscopy and internal medicine
- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) or equivalent
- Recently completed an internship or equivalent clinical experience (2 years)
- License from the Ordre des Médecins Vétérinaires du Québec before starting the program
- Working knowledge of French

TUITION FEES (Amounts shown are in Canadian currency):

- Landed immigrants and Canadian citizens living in Quebec, French citizens, Francophone Belgian citizens : +/- \$5,700 / year
- Landed immigrants and Canadian citizens not living in Quebec : +/- \$14,400 / year
- Other nationalities : +/- \$20,200 / year

SALARY: The candidate receives \$ 19 500 for 53 weeks. To these amounts are added 3.6 % for benefits and 3 % for the payment of public holidays.

Intern responsibilities:

- (1) Out-of-hour duties based on the clinical schedule;
- (2) Patient care during undergraduate student's vacation;
- (3) Clinical teaching duties.

PROGRAM DURATION: July 13th, 2022 to July 19th, 2023 (For the intern on call, the program will end at 8:00 am the next day)

- Students having done a traineeship at the University Hospital must provide their assessment with their application.

Candidate selection

The selected candidate will be contacted on **March 9th, 2022** by phone and email. The candidate will have 24 hours to accept or decline the position. If a candidate withdraws, the next candidate on the rank list will be contacted until all positions are filled. This rank list will not be disclosed. This process can take several days. Candidates on the waiting list will be notified by email and a written letter. Candidates not selected will be notified in writing.
