DESCRIPTION:

This residency is a 3-year (36 months), full time, postgraduate program of 108 credits obtained mostly from clinical training. A specialized study diploma (D.E.S.) is awarded upon completion of the program. Clinical training is provided in the field of veterinary anaesthesiology and pain management. This is an intensive clinical training in large and small animal anesthesia, including exotic animal anesthesia. Additional training is provided in other selected specialties to meet the requirements of the European College of Veterinary Anaesthesia and Analgesia (ECVAA). The resident will participate in the clinical care of hospitalized and ICU patients as well as outpatients. The resident is required to complete a research project. The successful candidate will participate in the daily supervision of undergraduate students and interns rotating through the anesthesia service as well as in selected teaching activities for undergraduate students. The resident will be included in the emergency schedule as needed by the service of anesthesiology including the third of holidays. Residents are eligible for 3 weeks holiday per year, the timing of which will be determined following discussion with the program director to ensure the needs of the service and hospital are met. Additionally, if the resident is not on call, he/she is eligible for statutory holidays. Any veterinary medical activities performed outside the residency program must be communicated to the program director and to the Vice Dean for Clinical Training and Continuing Education. The program is supported by two ECVAA Diplomats, and two residency-trained anesthesiologists. A third professor is expected to join the team in the next months. REQUIREMENTS:

- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) or equivalent
- Have recently completed an internship or have equivalent experience (2 years)
- License from the Ordre des Médecins Vétérinaires du Québec before starting the program
- Working knowledge of French

TUITION FEES (Amounts shown are in Canadian currency):

- Quebec, Canadian outside Quebec: On average \$16,293 for the duration of training
- French/French-speaking Belgian students: On average \$18,872 for the duration of training
- International students: On average \$60,728 for the duration of training, including the UdeM exemption scholarship

SALARY:

- \$27,000 /1st year
- \$29,000 /2nd year*
- \$31,000 /3rd year*

To these amounts are added \$1 782 for the 1st year, \$1 914 for the 2nd year and \$2 046 for the 3rd year (3.6 % for the payment of public holidays and 3 % for benefits).

A 2% contribution of gross salary will be deducted for union dues. Salary and conditions will follow the agreements stipulated in the collective agreement. Please note that depending on the specialty, a fee related to the specialty college may also be requested.

* Continuation of the program to a second and third year depends on the mutual satisfaction of the resident and the Faculty.

The resident has a \$3,200 allowance to attend conferences in his/her specialty, training program or book purchases (maximum \$CA 500).

When applicable, the resident participates in on-call service (on-call and disturbed on-call duty) in the evenings, weekends and public holidays, according to needs and the schedule established by the service, without, however, exceeding seventeen point three (17.3) weeks of on-call service over a period of twelve (12) months. For the purposes of the above-mentioned on-call service, additional remuneration will be granted per week, and the maximum amount paid will be \$5,190 / year.
