DESCRIPTION:

This rotating internship in veterinary clinical sciences is an intensive graduate training program of 12 months (53 weeks) duration. A certificate is awarded upon completion of the program. It essentially involves clinical surgical training and participation in clinical teaching, journal clubs, practical work and emergency surgery. The intern will work in the Centre Hospitalier Universitaire Vétérinaire (CHUV) as part of a team comprising a professor, an ophthalmologist in private practice and an animal health technician. The intern will participate in out-of-hours patient care and surgical emergencies. Rotations to other specialized departments will be encouraged during the program for more comprehensive training (anesthesia, neurology and intensive care). Participation to a research project leading to a publication will be encouraged. Interns are eligible for 3 weeks of vacation determined by the hospital. Veterinary medical activities performed outside the internship program must be declared to the Vice dean of clinical studies.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) or equivalent
- · Recently completed an internship in small animal medicine or equine medicine or equivalent clinical experience
- License from the Ordre des Médecins Vétérinaires du Québec before starting the program
- Internship in French

TUITION FEES (Amounts shown are in Canadian currency):

- Quebec, Canadian outside Quebec: On average \$6,665 for the duration of training
- French/French-speaking Belgian students: On average \$7,521 for the duration of training
- International students: On average \$24,962 for the duration of training, including the UdeM exemption scholarship

SALARY: The candidate receives \$ 19 500 for 53 weeks. To these amounts are added 1 287 \$ (3.6 % for the payment of public holidays and 3 % for benefits).

A 2% contribution of gross salary will be deducted for union dues. Salary and conditions will follow the agreements stipulated in the collective agreement.

The specialized intern is also allotted a total amount of \$500 to attend one conference in his specialty during his/her program.

Intern responsibilities:

(1) Out-of-hour duties based on the clinical schedule;

(2) Patient care during undergraduate student's vacation;

(3) Clinical teaching duties.

PROGRAM DURATION: July 9th, 2025 to July 15th, 2026 (For the intern on call, the program will end at 8:00 am the next day).
