POSITION: SPECIALIZED INTERNSHIP IN SURGICAL SMALL ANIMALS

NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: 1

DESCRIPTION:

This surgical internship in veterinary clinical sciences is an intensive clinical training program of 12 months (53 weeks) duration. A certificate is awarded upon completion of the program. The program encompasses clinical surgical training, active involvement in clinical teaching rounds, journal clubs, book clubs, practical laboratories and emergency surgeries. Interns will be based at the "Centre Hospitalier Universitaire Vétérinaire (CHUV)" and will work alongside a team consisting of 2 surgery professors, 1 surgery clinician and 1 surgery resident. The intern will participate in after-hours patient care and surgical emergencies on a rotating basis (one third of the year including weekends and holidays). Interns will be encouraged to partake in rotations within other specialty services during the program, such as anesthesia, neurology, and critical care, for a more comprehensive training experience. Opportunities for research projects will be provided, with designated weeks off from clinical duties. Interns are eligible for three non-consecutive vacation weeks determined by the program director. Any professional activities performed outside the internship program must be declared to the Vice dean of clinical studies.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) or equivalent
- Have recently completed an internship in small animal medicine and surgery
- License from the Ordre des Médecins Vétérinaires du Québec before starting the program
- Internship in French

TUITION FEES (Amounts shown are in Canadian currency):

- Quebec, Canadian outside Quebec: On average \$6,665 for the duration of training
- French/French-speaking Belgian students: On average \$7,521 for the duration of training
- International students: On average \$24,962 for the duration of training, including the UdeM exemption scholarship

REMUNERATION: The candidate receives \$ 19 500 for 53 weeks. To these amounts are added 1 287 \$ (3.6 % for the payment of public holidays and 3 % for benefits).

A 2% contribution of gross salary will be deducted for union dues. Salary and conditions will follow the agreements stipulated in the collective agreement.

The specialized intern is also allotted a total amount of \$500 to attend one conference in his specialty during his/her program.

Intern responsibilities:

- (1) Clinical activity and participation in out-of-hour and holiday duties (emergency surgeries and patient care) based on the clinical schedule;
- (2) Clinical teaching duties (participation in student teaching rounds and laboratories);
- (3) Participation in research activities and presentation of a seminar will be encouraged.
