

**SPECIALIZED INTERNSHIP IN VETERINARY CLINICAL SCIENCES (I.P.S.A.V. - 259017)

POSITION: SPECIALIZED INTERNSHIP IN DAIRY CATTLE POPULATION MEDICINE

NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: 1

DESCRIPTION:

This internship in veterinary clinical sciences is an intensive graduate training program of 12 months duration (53 weeks). A certificate is awarded upon completion. This program offers the opportunity to improve clinical skills in dairy herd health and production medicine, while allowing one to expand their knowledge in clinical epidemiology, nutrition, reproduction, udder health, etc. Training is primarily done through daily management of herds and data analysis, and through occasional second-line cases. This program provides clinical training and practical work in dairy herd medicine mainly and bovine ambulatory medicine. The intern will also participate in a clinical research project and in the transmission of results. The veterinarian enrolled in this program will work in the Centre Hospitalier Universitaire Vétérinaire (CHUV) and will be supervised by the coordinator of the program and the medical service chief of the ambulatory clinic. The intern is involved in out of hours and emergency care for patients of the bovine ambulatory service. Interns are eligible for 3 weeks vacation determined by the section head. Any professional activities performed outside the internship program must be declared to the Vice dean of clinical studies.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) or equivalent
- Have completed an internship certificate in bovine medicine or equivalent experience **before** starting the program
- License from the Ordre des Médecins Vétérinaires du Québec **before** starting the program
- Working knowledge of the French language (writing, reading, speaking) before starting the program

TUITION FEES (Fees shown are in Canadian currency):

- Quebec students or Canadian from outside of Quebec: On average \$6,665 for the duration of training
- French or French-speaking Belgian students: On average \$7,521 for the duration of training
- International students: On average \$24,962 for the duration of training, including the UdeM exemption scholarship

SALARY: The candidate receives \$ 19 500 for 53 weeks. To these amounts are added 1 287 \$ (3.6 % for the payment of public holidays and 3 % for benefits).

A 2% contribution of gross salary will be deducted for union dues. Salary and conditions will follow the agreements stipulated in the collective agreement.

The specialized intern is also allotted a total amount of \$500 to attend one conference in his specialty during his/her program.

This compensation will be paid for three functions performed by the intern during his/her program. These are:

- (1) Out-of-hour duties based on the clinical schedule;
- (2) Patient care during undergraduate student's vacation or absence;
- (3) Practical and clinical teaching duties.

PROGRAM DURATION: July 9th, 2025 to July 15th, 2026 (For the intern on call, the program will end at 8:00 am the next day)

- The email addresses of three references will be needed during the application process; the referees will have to fill out a form sent to them directly by the Université de Montréal and need to return the completed form. No other forms or reference letters will be needed;
- Students who have completed a clinical rotation at our Veterinary Teaching Hospital (CHUV) must provide their evaluation with their application for admission.

Candidate selection

The selected candidate will be contacted on **March 4th, 2025, 8:00 am** by phone and email. Each candidate will have 24 hours to accept or decline the position. If a candidate withdraws, the next candidate on the rank list will be contacted until all positions are filled. The rank list will not be disclosed. This process can take several days. Candidates on the waiting list and candidates not selected will be notified by email.
