<u>POSITION:</u> ZOOLOGICAL MEDICINE NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: 4

DESCRIPTION:

This veterinary clinical science internship is an intensive 12 months (53 weeks) post-graduate training program. A certificate is awarded upon completion. The program consists of a clinical training in zoological medicine and surgery at the Exotic Animals Clinic and the Birds of Prey Clinic of the Zoological Medicine Service. As part of this program, the intern will also have clinical exposure to animals from zoological institutions. The Zoological Medicine Service collaborates with other veterinary specialties (i.e. diagnostic imaging, ophthalmology, surgery, etc.) and the Exotic Animals Clinic works closely with the Companion Exotic Mammal Shelter. The Raptor Clinic is associated with a provincial raptor rehabilitation network and rehabilitation facilities. Clinical training is complemented with daily clinical rounds, journal clubs and pathology rounds. Interns are involved in teaching veterinary students. The interns will participate in the after hour emergency service offered by the Zoological Medicine Service on a rotating basis (every other week at most). Three weeks paid vacation/CE time is included and determined by the section head. If the intern is not on duty, he/she benefits from the same statutory holidays as other employees of the University of Montreal. Any professional activities performed outside the internship program must be declared to the Vice dean of clinical studies.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) or equivalent
- License from the Ordre des Médecins Vétérinaires du Québec before starting the program
- Internship in French

TUITION FEES (Amounts shown are in Canadian currency):

- Quebec, Canadian outside Quebec: On average \$6,665 for the duration of training
- French/French-speaking Belgian students: On average \$7,521 for the duration of training
- International students: On average \$24,962 for the duration of training, including the UdeM exemption scholarship

REMUNERATION: The candidate receives \$ 19 500 for 53 weeks. To these amounts are added 1 287 \$ (3.6 % for the payment of public holidays and 3 % for benefits).

A 2% contribution of gross salary will be deducted for union dues. Salary and conditions will follow the agreements stipulated in the collective agreement.

Intern responsibilities:

- (1) Clinical activity and participation in out-of-hour and holiday duties (emergency surgeries and patient care) based on the clinical schedule;
- (2) Clinical teaching duties (participation in student teaching rounds and laboratories);
- (3) Participation in research activities and presentation of a seminar will be encouraged.

PROGRAM DURATION: July 9th, 2025 to July 15th, 2026 (For the intern on call, the program will end at 8:00 am the next day)
